
# **Royal Bay Secondary School**

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# **Career Education Corner**

Welcome to the 2018/2019 school year! The RBSS Careers Department has been working to develop the Career Education program that supports the recent curriculum redesign.

The Career Education curriculum supports students in becoming successful, educated citizens by helping them learn how to effectively manage their life journey toward preferred future possibilities. This area of learning requires students to identify and develop their personal interests, passions, and competencies. Students reflect on learning experiences in school and community, build confidence through their contributions, and explore multiple career-life roles and choices. The curriculum fosters lifelong learning, beginning in Kindergarten and continuing through to graduation and beyond (Ministry of Education, 2018).

RBSS students will be engaging in Career Education, during selected Focus Blocks. All students have been placed in a group called a house. Students will be introduced to their "house" on the first day of classes. These "houses" will rotate through Career Education lessons every three weeks. Attendance is mandatory and is required for the successful completion of their Career Education requirements.

#### **MyBlueprint**

To increase interaction between parents, students and teachers, we are bringing in a new program for teachers called MyBlueprint. The MyBlueprint platform is used for career education, digital portfolios and self-assessment core competencies from kindergarten to Grade 12.

This is a Canadian-based platform offering curriculum related to career education and storage space for digital portfolios for learning, communicating progress and assessment. MyBlueprint also offers a continuous look into each child's learning that teachers, parents and students share. Information on how parents can sign up to view their students' progress will be sent out soon. <sup>(C)</sup>
