#### Dear Grade 12 Student:

If you are planning to go onto *any* form of post-secondary education after graduation, or if you are unsure of what you want to do after you leave Royal Bay, you might be interested in this 4-credit (mostly) online course to help you:

figure out what you want to study

discover which schools offer the program(s) that best suit your needs/interests/aptitudes

find career paths that interest you

check out which institutions you might want to attend and how/when to apply

what a GAP Year entails

access direct links to a variety of scholarships and bursaries in addition to government financial aid.

The goal of **PSP 12DL** is to help you fulfill your post-secondary education goals and give you direct access the types of funding available. *Every* assignment you complete will be of benefit to you; the coursework is not intended be onerous, but instead supportive of your post-secondary goals.

#### Travel opportunity for students in grades 9 and 10

For those of you who like to plan ahead (and save money) we would like to inform you about a trip we are planning to the south of Spain for March, 2021. Our last trip to Spain, during spring break 2018, was a wonderful opportunity for students to learn about Spanish culture and to practice speaking Spanish. Some parents suggested that for our next trip it would be helpful to parents if we could start planning earlier in order to lower the monthly cost of the trip. The overall cost, including airfare, hotels, excursion fees, food (except lunches), transportation costs and entry fees for 10 days in Spain is \$4014.00 or 29 monthly payments of \$136.69 as of September 1st, 2018. In addition, students who enroll before January, 2019, will receive an additional \$300 off with the code Haddon300.
