

Please read through ALL of the information below about how to log into myBlueprint.

If you have followed these steps, and you are still unable to access myBlueprint, please see Ms. ten Hove in Room 2105B during A or B Blocks.

1) Consent:

- a. Ensure that your parents have provided consent. You do not have consent if you see the following when you try to log in: "PEN does not match" or spinning wheel.
- b. The link to the 'Consent' portal: https://consent.sd62.bc.ca/apps/OnlineConsent

2) Logging in:

- a. Go to the link attached (use Google/Google Chrome): https://app.myblueprint.ca/?sdid=sd62
- b. Select "School Account Log in" in the green bar, middle of the screen page.
- c. This will take you to the Sooke Potholes picture and single sign on. Use your wifi log in credentials, and if you have consent, you are in. --->Your wifi login and password are what you use when you access the school wifi on your phone. It should be your first name initial and your last name initial, plus four digits from your student number (ex.Jacqui tenHove: jt5564).

Many of our buses and routes fill quickly. Please register close to opening so that you get a spot!

As in previous years, we will be using the School Cash Online system for school bus registration. Registration is of course, free for families.

Please note:

- Registration will open on time
- Parents will not be able to select bus routes.
- Experienced Transportation staff will place your child(ren) on the best routes as per your home address and school.
- If you register by June 1, you will be notified as to which bus routes your child(ren) will be on before the end of the school year.
- Bus passes will be handed out to middle and secondary students prior to or during the first week of school in September
- Bus passes only apply to middle and secondary school students. Attendance will be taken in the elementary grades.
- Drivers will begin enforcing passes during the first week of school in September.

Bring your old cell phones and accessories to the Learning Commons for Recycling and raise money for RBSS!

What can be collected?

The Challenge will accept all old, damaged and out-of-use cell phones, smartphones, wireless PDAs, and pagers. We will also accept rechargeable cell phone batteries and accessories, but these will not count towards your total.

We do not accept cordless phones, walkie-talkies, non-wireless PDAs, Mp3 players, any battery not commonly found in a cell phone (example: single use batteries, rechargeable AA batteries), laptop computers or answering machines.

What happens to the phones and other items that we collect?

Mobile devices that are collected are sent to GREENTEC for processing. Shipments arriving at GREENTEC are sorted, evaluated and tested to assess their functionality.

Phones are first tested to assess their ability to power on. Devices which power on then receive a data wipe to remove any confidential information which may have been left on by the consumer. Components, including the LCD screen, keypad, battery, antenna and casing, are evaluated. Phones deemed to be in good condition are then inspected for water damage and "call tested" to confirm their functionality. Phones that pass as functional are then sold for reuse.

Phones that do not power on, or do not pass the functionality evaluation, are separated for material recovery by recycling. Devices are broken down to their base components (metals or plastics), and then sent to approved processors.

The money raised will go to the Leadership Class, with the request that it be put toward another environmental initiative in our school.

18 cell phones collected so far.

Each cell phone dropped off = 1 entry to the draw for a \$25 gift card to Tim Hortons





"The rainbow flag, commonly known as the gay pride flag or LDBTQ2+ pride flag, is a symbol of Queer pride and Queer so cial movements. Other older uses of rainbow flags include a symbol of peace. The colors reflect the diversity of the Queer community, as the flag is often used as a symbol of Queer pride during Queer rights marches. While this use of the rainbow flag originated in Northern California's San Francisco Bay Area, the flag is now used worldwide

Originally devised by San Francisco artist Cilbert Baker, the design has undergone several revisions since its debut in 1978, first to remove colors then restore them based on availability of fabrics. The most common variant consists of six stripes: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and violet. The flag is typically flown horizontally, with the red stripe on top, as it would be in a natural rainbow."


