

myBlueprint LOGGING In

Please read through ALL of the information below about how to log into myBlueprint.

If you have followed these steps, and you are still unable to access myBlueprint, please see Ms. ten Hove in Room 2105B during A or B Blocks.

1) Consent:

- a. Ensure that your parents have provided consent. You do not have consent if you see the following when you try to log in: "PEN does not match" or spinning wheel.
- b. The link to the 'Consent' portal: <https://consent.sd62.bc.ca/apps/OnlineConsent>

2) Logging in:

- a. Go to the link attached (use Google/Google Chrome): <https://app.myblueprint.ca/?sdid=sd62>
- b. Select "School Account Log in" - in the **green bar**, middle of the screen page.
- c. This will take you to the Sooke Potholes picture and single sign on.
Use your wifi log in credentials, and if you have consent, you are in. --->Your wifi login and password are what you use when you access the school wifi on your phone. It should be your first name initial and your last name initial, plus four digits from your student number (ex.Jacqui tenHove: jt5564).
- b. You should not need a PEN number to sign up. If you do, it may be because you don't have parent consent. See point #1 above.

School Newsletter Reminder wording for MMR Catch-up

Reminder messaging:

Recently, Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR) immunization consent packages for select grade 10-12 students were sent home from the school. If you have not already done so, please review the information with your child as an opportunity for them to start making decisions about their own health. Please complete the consent form and return it to the school in a sealed envelope as soon as possible. If your consent package indicated that we have no or incomplete immunization records for your child, please attach this information to the consent form.

Although a child may be immunized with the consent of a parent/guardian or representative, a high school student can make an informed decision regarding immunization regardless of parental consent or refusal. This is referred to as “mature minor consent.”

The cost of the event is \$20 for athletes and free for guests as they will be arriving after the meal (coffee and finger desserts will be offered).



