BC Excellence Scholarships

The Provincial Government offers **55 BC Excellence Scholarships** annually to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Successful students will have demonstrated community service, both inside and outside of school, and shown aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a **\$5000 scholarship voucher** to use for post-secondary tuition. To be considered as **Royal Bay's student nominee**, you must first complete the application package which includes:

A resume (emphasizing your school & community service, volunteer experience, academic successes, etc.)

Two reference letters (one from a community member/organization and one from your school or a teacher)

A written statement, maximum 500 words, in which you describe:

What led you to your most relevant community service, volunteer activity, and/or leadership role;

What you learned from this experience;

How this experience will benefit you in your chosen career path.


