A day to celebrate and give our students and their advocates an opportunity to champion for the rights, inclusion and well-being of people with Down Syndrome.

Dear Parent or Guardians of Grade 12 students;

Royal Bay Secondary will be writing the Graduation Numeracy Assessment 10 (GNA 10) during the timeframe April 15 and April 16, 2020. The April sitting is the LAST sitting of the 2019/2020 school year. All grade 12 students need to have this assessment completed in order to graduate. Most students have written this over the last two years, but if they haven't written it they need to make arrangements through the Royal Bay office.

Students are assessed on a four point proficiency scale - Emerging, Developing, Proficient and Extending

- There is no "pass" or "fail" students must write the assessments in order to meet the BC grad requirements. Students have a chance to rewrite the assessments if they like.
- The mark is not blended with any subject as was the case with past provincial examinations. The mark stands alone on the student's transcript.

Media Design—Mythical Beasts

Media Design students were given the creative and technical challenge of creating a mythical beast. They were required to use at least five different animal parts, then blend and match colour to create a believable new creature. Next they chose a creative way of presenting their beast using a new background and told the viewer a little more about their personality and where they come from.

The Loup de la Forêt is a fabled creature from deep in the forests of France. It is thought to be a guardian that takes to the skies to protect the forest. While its powers are unknown many speculate it gains special power from the beasts that make up its body. It has the eyes of a Crocodile, claws of a Raven, the wings of an Eagle, antlers of a Deer and the body of a Maned Wolf.



My creature is based around the Kelpie, also known as a water kelpie, this is a shape -shifting water spirit which is known for inhabiting the pools of Scotland. This creature is from a Celtic legend and in other cultures known to be a black horse like creature and able have a human form. From the legend they haunt rivers and drag children in or they appear as a beautiful woman to lure men where they drag them in the river and eat them. They have a sticky magical hide that once touched you cannot escape and get dragged under the surface of water. They are known to summon up floods of water to sweep travelers to their deaths. 


Easter Egg Hunt at Meadow Park Saturday, April 11th, 2020
