Will the school closure affect my ability to graduate?

Education Minister Rob Fleming assured us that any student that is on track to graduate, will graduate.

Is the graduation ceremony cancelled?

At this point in time, we are waiting on confirmation from the Ministry of Education regarding the Numeracy Assessment.

Due to the current circumstances, I no longer want to leave the area for post-secondary school. Can I still apply to UVic?

UVic has advised us that several programs still have open applications. Since you will not be able to self-report your grades, you will not receive a decision until mid-May when the Admissions Office receives the Ministry download of grades. It is crucial that all applicants request their Ministry transcript through the Student Transcript Service. The following programs are still accepting applications:

ENGINEERING (Year 1) – closes 30 April 2020
COMPUTER SCIENCE – closes 30 April 2020
HEALTH & COMMUNITY SERVICES – closes 15 May 2020
ART HISTORY & VISUAL STUDIES – closes 30 April 2020
