Bienvenido y bienvenue to a new feature of our weekly newsletter where we show a snapshot of what's happening around the school. As you have probably guessed from the title, this week we are focusing on the Languages Department. At Royal Bay we are fortunate to have exciting and thriving programs in both Spanish

and French. Our four language teachers (Madame Chalmers, Señora Haddon, Señora Treminio and Señora White) offer language instruction from beginner level, grade 9 and intro 11, through to grade 12. For the second and third octas, we have a student teacher, Kay Gallivan, joining us in Spanish 9 and 12 classes. Our programs are built around comprehensible input techniques (AIM for French and TPRS for Spanish) with a focus on storytelling, acting and the natural acquisition of language in a fast-paced, fun environment. Students achieve a high level of fluency in French and Spanish over their four years at Royal Bay, which looks great on a resume, helps them get in to university and makes travelling easier for the rest of their lives; it also makes them sound very cool. Parents, keep in mind that one of the great perks of having a child in a language class is that they can come home and teach you!























It's that time of year again! Royal Bay Leadership students are putting on the 10,000 Tonight food drive over the course of 2 weeks, beginning Monday, November 30th through Friday, December 11th. 10,000 Tonight is the Westshore's largest non-perishable food drive. Last

year, the 3 high schools in SD62 combined to donate over 30,000 items to local food banks in the Westshore. All food/money collected at Royal Bay is donated to the Goldstream Food Bank.

We know that with the current circumstances, 10,000 Tonight is going to look a bit different this year. Instead of going door to door, we will be collecting food and participating in a school-wide competition to see which class (both AM and PM) can collect the most! There will be individual



boxes in each classroom where students can bring items from home and add them to their class collection bin each day. Prizes will be awarded to our top 3 classes.


