#### Attention Grade 11's & 12!

If you're interested in a career in trades...WE HAVE THE PROGRAM FOR YOU!!!

TASK (Trades Awareness Skill & Knowledge) will help you make an informed decision about which trade would be the best fit for you. TASK is a "hands on" program in partnership with Camosun College that focuses on four trade areas: **carpentry, metal trades, electrical and plumbing**. Students will get practical experience building a variety of projects such as; Sheds, Car Ports, Garages, etc. Upon successful completion of the Trades Awareness Program, students will receive Industry Training Authority (ITA) C.O.R.E. certification from Camosun College. To ensure students are "job ready", students will also take entry-level industry certifications and go out on a work placement for two weeks. This program is one full semester and will give students up to 28 high school credits. Please contact Mr. Bobbitt, or your counsellor if interested.


