- Paula reported that BCPAC sent in a resolution for getting mental health in all schools. We are lucky here in the Sooke area to have extra supports for mental health. There have been resolutions like this one before but they never passed. The BCCPAC AGM will be on May 1, 2021.

• Principal's Report:

- It has been a busy six weeks. Last week, Martin Lait had gone through our Grad assessments. The Numeracy and Literacy assessments have all been completed.
- The French Immersion Program will begin this fall with approximately 100 students. Students will be moved over from Belmont. It will eventually expand to 400 students. School's population will expand to approximately 1400-1500 students at that point.
- The COVID-19 exposure at our school was handled very well and the policy developed worked. There was no transmission in the school. It proved that the current policies had worked well. There was a lot of

- concern from parents and students but after no other case was identified, everything got back to normal.
- Sports are not happening that much at the school.
- We just got the 11th student getting a Lacross Scholarship
- The administration is starting weekly Virtual Grade Assemblies throughout the school.
- The grade nine and tens have been connecting with their counsellors for their course selections for next year. We are hoping we will be back to normal operations (pre- Covid) in September. We will be doing a survey of our parents soon to help us decide on our ¼ model or back to normal.
- Surprisingly about 300 of our students have been employed during this
 year, a huge increase from last year. Thankfully, this has kept our
 students busy.
- The murals are going ahead in March. Danielle H is full steam ahead with the crosswalk.
- The daily attendance rate is 92-93% which is very high. The courses have a 98% completion rates. We are now about to enter Octa #5.
- The mental health of our students is of great concern. There is so much of our school right now that is completed online. The school will be hosting Jack Talks Mental Health School Wide Presentation via MS Teams on Feb 23 at 9:30am and 1:00pm. Danielle Huculak will be leading the Virtual Night for Parents. Date TBA.
- The Grads and parents will be receiving communication soon about the upcoming grad ceremonies and events. Right now, provincial Health guidelines are in place and unless they lift, the traditional prom would not be able to go ahead or the large group graduation ceremonies. The staff is assuming that the small grad ceremonies could happen but nothing will be approved until closer to the cut off dates. The staff will continually work to make anything possible happen.

(Some technical problems were experienced as Mike had to continual move about his house to reestablish connection).

5. NEW BUSINESS:

a) FUNDING REQUESTS (Salome C)

- i) <u>Livestream Equipment -\$2500</u>: The administration was interested in getting livestream equipment for student activities /events which includes whole school and smaller group. Discussion centered around how this was intended to help the full school community and was definitely a request the group would be able to support.
- **Career Education- \$400:** The career education department was interested in providing prizes to encourage grade 12 students to apply for scholarships.

- iii) Studio Art Drum Making -\$1100: Norma Jean, the studio art teacher was looking for more funding for the drum making class. The PAC has already approved a request this year for the Excel Class. Mike indicated the school will be able to help Norma Jean out with this project.
- **Grad Label Pins -\$925:** Request from teacher to help cover the grad lapel grad pin. The PAC has done this in the past. Mike indicated the school may be able to cover this.

Motion #4- Add the line in the 2020-2021 PAC Budget for the" Livestream Equipment" to the full amount of \$2500. Moved by Salome C/Cindy F. Carried unanimously.

b) **DRY GRAD**

- Marianne reported that the Dry Grad committee have decided to go ahead with an
 Instagram Prize Giveaway for the graduates. This will happen on June 5. The committee
 already have donations from local businesses and are expecting more to follow. While
 the committee realizes that many businesses will not be able to give, they are hopeful
 they will be able to accumulate enough to create excitement and give something to the
 graduates as a fun event.
