- School is settled with 3-4 new registrations for a total of 1480 students
- Second semester still growing. Cafeteria up and running
- Electric bike has been donated to RBSS. Busy moving into term 2. Parent teacher will be on 18 November online or in person.
- Nice to be in the building and hearing the kids again. Learning gaps with some kids with being out of school for so long. Working with the departments to help the students
- Covid update; 2 exposures, but not a big enough risk to notify anyone.
- No dancing at Winter formal. Option at Westin Bear Mountain for 150 kids for a dinner restaurant style. Not possible due to 50% capacity (342). This would not include the entire Grad class. Considering option at school instead of dance; live performance, magic show

5. **NEW BUSINESS**:

a) Robin Ruff and Mathew Kemshaw – presentation

- Robin Ruff is a Home Ec teacher at RBSS, Mathew Kemshaw is the School Garden Educator, EMCS Society. He is also working with leadership in the district to bring students out.
- Robin Ruff and Mathew Kemshaw gave the PAC a presentation regarding the RBSS Garden and hopes for the future
- To create a food production area biodiverse garden
- Water lines put in foundation area for learning center. Grant from City of Colwood for a shed.
- Getting more growing space which can then include a compost area
- Food prep and gathering area
- Veg production area, herb, fruiting vines, bamboo, blueberries, and fruit trees
- Design by Mathew, students, Indigenous Peoples and Elders
- Irrigation installed. \$500 for three compost bins, \$2000 to get started on garden

- 60 by 40 for blank slate, wheelchair accessible, mainlines in for water but need more
- Students and Mathew working together to get this garden done
- Mathew has installed irrigation system. He will start a garden club with students
- Different themes for plants for the garden sections

b) Mike Huck – presentation

- Presentation on a notable school presenter Dr. Lisa Gunderson from One Love Consulting. She provides anti-black and anti-racism/equity services to organizations, government, and businesses. She also works with the police force. These services include professional development training, consultation, and motivational speaking. She also provides limited clinical supervision for current counsellors who service BIPOC
- RBSS has the first LGBTQ flag crosswalk.
- Mike would like to have her speak to teachers on how to talk gracefully with students. Would like to hold assemblies with each grade in November (each grade will be spilt into two assemblies). \$3000 total
- Wants to create a judgement free safe place
