  - <u>Communications:</u>

  - <u>SPEAC:</u>

- many new teachers in the school
- lots of staff going on leave
- staff are tired
- School meetings remain online, but PAC is meeting in person
- Launch of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester went well, had to add more higher-level classes to meet demand (students waiting to 2<sup>nd</sup> semester to take the harder classes, or are retaking to get better grades)
- Gentle reminders for masks and using hand sanitizing stations
- Girls Basketball team is going to "The Islands" in Nanaimo in February
- Provincial assessments mid-year were cancelled, June assessments not known if moving forward or not
- March 7<sup>th</sup> mandated vaccinations for teachers
- Grade 9 immunizations Feb. <sup>3</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub>
- Course selection process starts week of Feb. 7<sup>th</sup>
- Grade 8 parent night Feb. 3<sup>rd</sup> online
- Expecting an update on next year's attendance numbers soon, funded to 1400 students, which means likely 1600 students
