## Youth Climate Survey

What is Climate Change?

Think of climate change as an extra blanket wrapped around earth that is keeping it too warm. That extra blanket is created mostly from burning fossil fuels like gas, coal, diesel and oil. When we use fossil fuels to drive cars, heat homes and create the things we buy in stores, we are making that blanket thicker. This makes the earth too warm and changes our planet's climate. We mostly experience climate change through weird, wild and warm weather.

Remember: *climate* and *weather* are not the same thing. Weather is monitored and described based on what is happening day to day or from year to year, but climate is measured over longer periods of time. In our region, scientists use seasonal temperature, rainfall averages, wind patterns, and even average growing seasons to measure climate over time. It is important to remember that even if we have a particularly cold winter or cooler summer, historical data combined with projections from advanced global models, show our climate is still getting warmer over time. The image below shows the change in global temperatures since 1860. You can see that in the last 20 years the climate has shifted to be much warmer than is natural for our planet.

The good news is we know what we need to do and if we all work together we can make a real difference on climate change and protect our shared home.

The City of Colwood is creating a Low Carbon Resilience (LCR) plan. The LCR plan will guide how our community will rapidly reduce pollution that causes climate change and prepare for extreme weather and other impacts of the changing climate. To make sure the LCR plan reflects local values, we are gathering community input and including the voice and perspective of Colwood youth is a priority.


#### **SCIENCES AT ROYAL BAY**


## **Grad 2023 Colour**
