#### September 29 and 30

École Royal Bay Secondary School will recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 29<sup>th</sup>.

- Please encourage your students to wear orange on Thursday, September 29.
- Many of our students are participating in an assembly during B block for the presentation of a film which recognizes and celebrates our very own Brother Rick Peter RBSS Elder in Residence. Brother Rick has been an instrumental member of our school community and has a large presence in the school.

Other classes will watch the film in their classrooms.

#### National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The day honours the children who never returned home and survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and the ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

This federal statutory holiday was created through legislative amendments made by Parliament.



# Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day will take place on September 30.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.


