## Remembrance Day 2022

Today, at École Royal Bay Secondary School, we acknowledge the sacrifices made in service by Canadian soldiers fighting for freedom and the challenges faced by Canadian Peacekeepers around the world.

Across Canada, and in many other countries, people gather on November 11<sup>th</sup> to honour the courage and devotion of brave men and women who made the supreme sacrifice of serving and dying for their country.

The year 1918 and the end of the First World War—the origin of Remembrance Day—seem so long ago in the context of many of our lives today. However, at the same time, the reality of war and conflict, is only as far away as a veteran, a family member, friend or neighbour who has been touched by that war or those that have followed






