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- Mike is in Avalon, France exploring FI exchange opportunities
 - Grade 11's would go over the year before for their portion of the exchange (2 weeks

before or after spring break plus the spring break for a total of a month)

- Then students from France would visit here the following year (when the grade 11's are in grade 12)
- Met Mr. Ryan Dube (new VP)
- Grad events
 - Trying to be efficient with clerical time and for families, sent all forms all at once
 - Forms have gone out for Carnival, Prom, Grad Tickets
 - Prices the same as last year for events
 - Deadlines are different for each event, but all forms have been handed out all at once in Block A to grade 12
 - All are available in the office too
 - And emails with printable forms were sent too
 - Carnival
 - \$55/person
 - Graduation ceremony
 - \$50 Grad fee covers faux leather certificate holder with a 5x7 of their grad pic, plus grad gown, stole, cap and tassel. All can be kept by students after ceremony
 - \$5 ceremony fee per guest covers the fee school pays to UVic
 - Lifetouch will take pictures of kids shaking hands with Mike once they've crossed the stage
 - Photos will be emailed to families
 - Prom at Crystal Garden
 - \$145/ticket
 - Info has been posted to google classroom with sequence of events. Page was also sent home
 - Pics behind legislature at 5
 - Dinner is served at 6:45, dance starts at 8. Wrap up at 10:30. Photo booth available as well
 - Tanya will confirm dinner
 - Beef dish, pasta dish, salad, dessert
 - Adult is required to escort kids in. Can be 1 adult with a group of kids. Limos cannot deliver kids to event, but CAN pick them up
 - Lifetouch will be at parliament buildings to get full grad class shot
 - To save on decoration costs, Belmont, RBSS and Claremont are all sharing decorations (seat covers, sashes, etc)
 - Breakdown of costs:
 - \$9000 just to open door to Crystal Gardens (includes table and chairs)
 - \$104/plate for food (includes gratuities)
 - DJ/Luna Photobooth/Decorations
 - Pricing for tickets is basically break even given costs
 - Worked hard to look for venues that would be less cost, but not many who could accommodate size of grad class
 - Looking for volunteer parents to help put chair covers over chairs on June 22 (day before prom) sometime that afternoon
- Grad assessments
 - Happen 4 times per year
 - April 24-27 Grade 10 semester 2 math and English will write their numeracy and literacy assessments
 - Tanya went around to Grade 10 to talk about what this will look like on their

transcripts

- Helped to alleviate the stresses of writing this assessment
- 2 more opportunities to write this if they're not happy with original results
- UBC requires a 3 on the literacy 12 assessment, but most post-secondary schools don't yet have requirements for these assessments yet
- Parent-teacher interviews are happening on April 20
 - Allow 10 mins between appointments if you're doing in-person
- Rugby is expanding at RBSS
- Bell schedule will be the same for next year
- Timetable is being built now
- Growth is happening at this school
 - Working on a bunch of situations like out-of-district students joining academies when they shouldn't be etc.
- Affordability fund
 - Accounting for this has been a challenge
 - Need to tell government exactly where items were purchased
 - Very detailed accounts of how funds were spent needs to be sent back to gov which has been a challenge
- Online learning moving to high schools now
 - Blended learning will move to high schools which should give more opportunities to students
- Events from last month
 - Pajama Game had 4 performances
 - RCMP came and did a flash mob and handed out items
 - Surveys going out to families
- Layoff line for teachers this year was 3.5 yrs seniority
 - Causes stress for so many teachers
 - Working to make the postings match what's needed for each class
- Crosswalk repair
 - Are making plans to repaint rainbow crosswalk with a better paint that will hold up better
 - Last year facilities did it for the school
 - School will be sourcing better paint for this newest painting of the crosswalk
