Dear RBSS Families and Guardians;

If you can believe it, we are already nearing the end of the first Quarter! As I mentioned in our last Raven's Nest, the positive energy and buzz in the building has been fantastic as we have started another school year! I am thankful to our students and staff for working so hard to help us begin the school year well.

We have had many families throughout the school coming to sporting events, cultural event and connecting with staff and learning about their student's schedules and daily routine. I am appreciative of the staff who always have time to meet all our RBSS families and to welcome them in the school.

Our Royal Bay Community is growing! Over the last few years, we have seen a lot of development in the area that our students are accessing and benefitting from. We are starting to get services in the area that were non-existent just a couple of years ago. The most popular spot is the Quality Foods and Starbucks just across the street. Many of our students can be found here during lunch getting food and drinks.

Quality Foods has been very supportive of the school – they have hired over 55 students and work with our STRIDE program for job placements giving students incredible work experience and mentoring. While most of our students are doing great in these establishments – some are creating issues. We continue to address the need to be positive neighbours in the area through student assemblies, announcements over the PA systems and through our routine visits to the new shopping area. These messages include;

- Respectful language and behavior in the community.
- No littering and pick up after lunch in the local parks
- Quality Foods and Starbucks are not parks. Students should be able to access the building like anyone else, but they should also behave in respectful manners. Currently the stores are working with students around issues of lingering in the parking lots, boisterous behavior in the stores and unfortunately, theft. Both stores now have Loss Prevention Officers and staff limiting access.

As we settle into the school year, if you could please help us build good habits with students that would be appreciated. Here are some ways that you can help:

- Please help students be on time. We know that sometimes mornings can be hectic, but we do encourage our students to be on time for classes. Of course, we understand that things come up and it is not always possible, but we do hope for our students to be punctual.
- Please help keep our students safe. We have noticed a number of parents dropping their students off on Ryder Hesjedal Way. Please do not stop in the roadway and drop your student off on the street. This is unsafe. As you know our parking lot is very busy during peak drop-off and pick-up times, so if you can drop-off in surrounding areas or encourage your student to walk or ride a bike, that is great.
- If you have questions or concerns about something related to your student's classes, please be sure to reach out to the teacher first.

Reminders

Reminder to Parents the Parking Expectation:

As you may be aware, two portables have been installed in the staff parking lot. This has resulted in the loss of a number of staff parking stalls and one of the exits to this lot. With over 150 staff members and only 130 parking stalls available, we encourage all members of our school community to consider alternative transportation options, such as walking, taking public transport, or cycling to school whenever possible.

To address the after-school traffic congestion, we kindly request your cooperation in considering the following suggestions:

1. **Choosing Alternative Meeting Spots:** We ask that you make arrangements with your student(s) for a meeting spot other than the staff lots and the front of the school. Please note that parents are NOT permitted to park in staff lots.
2. **Arriving at 3:30 PM Mon-Thur, 2:30 PM Fri:** If you are picking up your students after school, we suggest arriving 10 minutes after the bell to allow time for the majority of students to clear the building and use the crosswalk. This will help alleviate congestion during the peak dismissal period. We understand that time may vary for each family, but arriving a bit later can significantly ease the traffic situation.
3. **NO Idle Zone:** While waiting for your student, turn your vehicle off.

Reminder to return the salmon colored **student emergency release form** that was given to students to bring home at the beginning of September. This form is **NOT** used to update contact information. Students can hand the completed form to the office or it can be scanned and emailed to royalbay@sd62.bc.ca


