  - Are PACs fundraising for bursaries or just not doing them
- New bus rider tracking system coming for next year

## • Principal's Report:

- Really good start to the school year so far
- Orange Shirt Day Event on Sept. 29
  - Metis Society of Victoria brought a teepee and some furs for kids to look at
  - Kookum Jo Ina Young came to school to help
  - Drumming in library with Brother Rick
- Holocaust Survivor Play by Holocaust Society this week
  - For grade 10 socials
  - German Exchange students provided some context on their perspectives of the war
- Student learning conferences
  - Teachers will have autonomy to meet with parents, not necessarily all on one night, but teachers can decide how best to communicate with parents
  - Likely will have more traditional parent-teacher in November 23, but April's parent-teacher might look different
- Galiano kids came back today
  - Had a great time for the 3 nights they were there
  - This was for the outdoor ed class
- Working with Quality Foods about the kids going to the store during lunch time
  - Store has complaints about the number of students eating lunch there at lunch time
  - Ultimately, it's up to the store to figure out how to deal with the issues they're noticing
  - Currently adding a loss prevention staff member to help deal with the small number of kids who are stealing
- 1701s are done (official count of student FTE for BC Gov)
  - Numbers are up, but not by as much as had been predicted
  - Seeing lots of movement of families moving out of district/out of province
  - 1597 FTE
  - 1620 students
- University day is happening in October
  - Grade 12 students will get to talk to all BC universities
  - Will be other Canada-wide universities later in the fall
- Grade 9 take your student to school day on November 1
- Scholarships assemblies happening for Grade 12 later this fall
  - Suggestion from parent to invite Grade 11 students so that they can start planning for what they'll apply for when they hit Grade 12
- Game Ready program being re-introduced
  - Ex-pro athletes to run after school programs
  - Get kids who are disengaged to match with these athletes to help re-engage with them
  - 15 kids at our school will be participating
  - Seeing some "gang" type activities in the Westshore (not Royal Bay) targeting affluent students getting them involved in money schemes
- Grade 11 French Immersion Info night for the student exchange (October 5 at 6:00 pm)
