

English Department

The end of the first semester brought the conclusion of Royal Bay's first ever Dual Credit English 151 class. Over the course of the first five months, two classes of grade twelve students completed both their high school English class at the same time as taking their first-year university English course with a Camosun professor. Moving forward, these

students will have one less university class to complete during their first year as they've already finished it.

The College Prep path in grade ten and eleven allows students to increase the rigor in their communication skills and develop the habits and acumen they'll need for grade 12 and their education beyond.

As part of the novel study of Mary Shelley's Frankenstein students created a wide variety of projects to show their learning and interpretation of this classic and essential novel. 
Parent Volunteer Opportunity:


