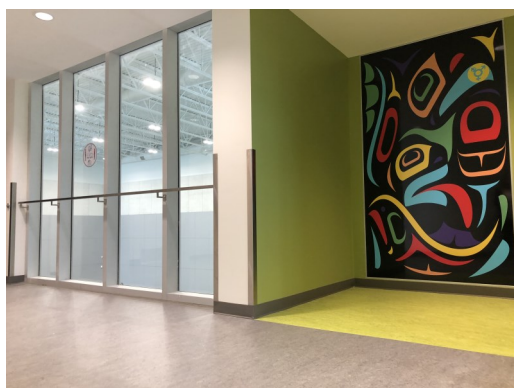

This is a very prestigious golf tournament with many strong past winners. The accomplishments of the team and coach Randy Dunbar speak to the hard work, dedication and talent of our Royal Bay Golfers. This tournament is often used as a run up to the Islands and the BC High School Championship later this month.
