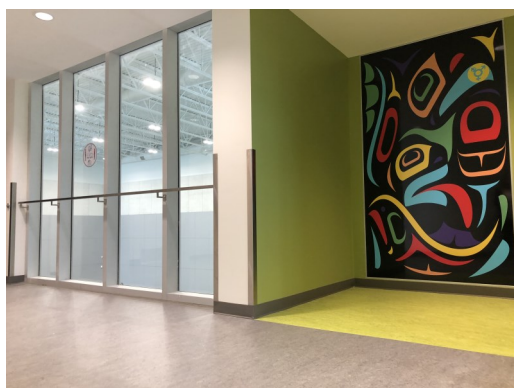

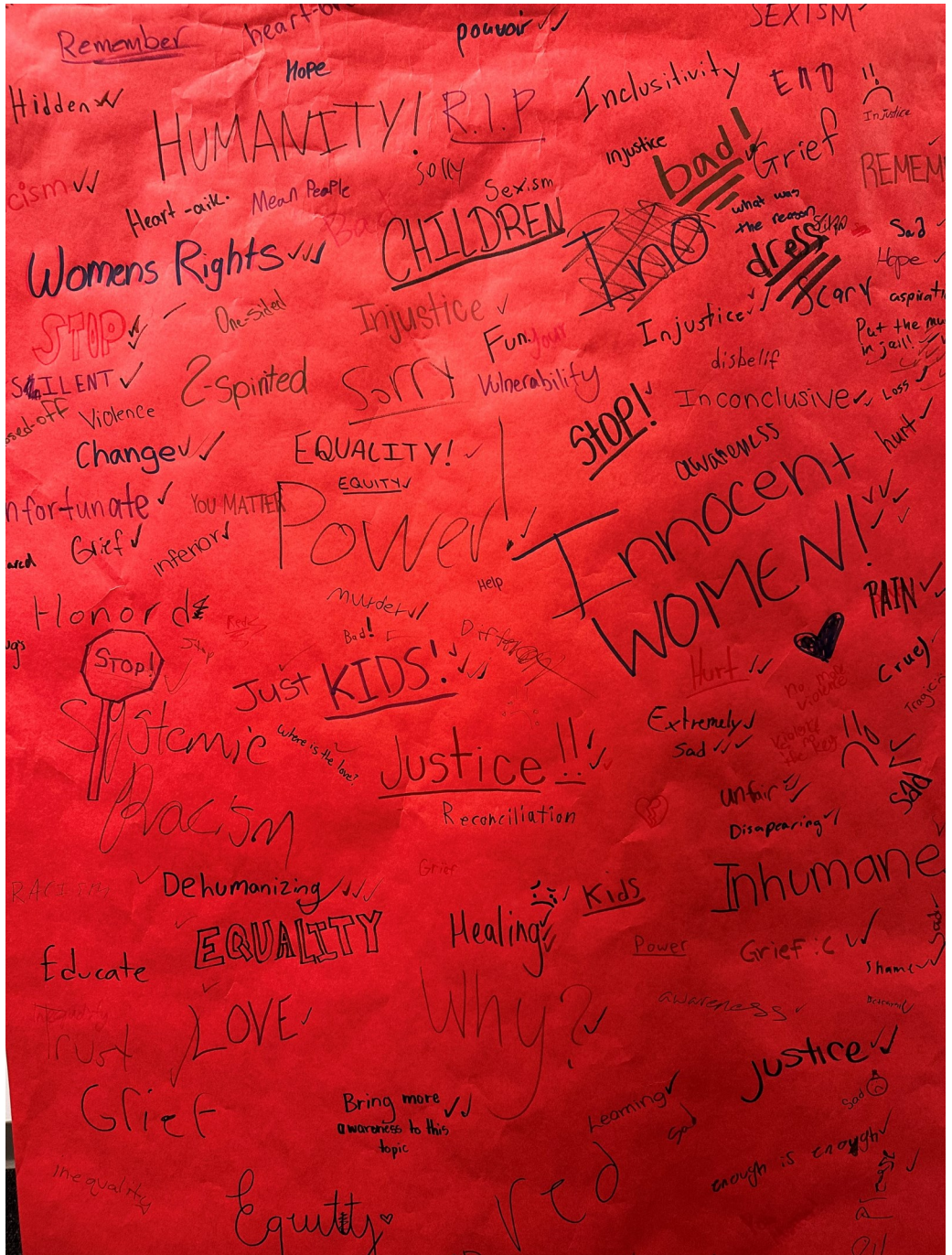

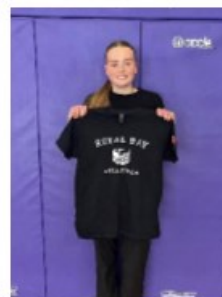


CHARLIE H.

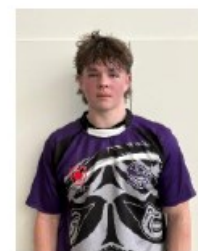


