I hope that everyone enjoys a wonderful winter break, filled with rest, laughter, and time with family and friends.



# **Provincial Assessments**

January 12-14, 2026, Grade 12 students will be writing the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment LTE12. On January 12, 2026, our French Immersion students in Grade 12 will write LTF12. To ensure that students are lined up to graduate on time, we do our best to have as many Grade 12 students as possible write their assessment during this time. Another opportunity will be offered in April for those who want a second sitting and/or were not able to write the first time due to extenuating circumstances.

January 21/22, 2026, all ERBSS will be operating on a **Copernican Block schedule** (double blocks of two classes each day). The blocks for January 21, 2026 will be **AA CC** and January 22, 2026 will be **BB DD**. If you have a student in English 10 or Math 10 this Semester, they will be writing their assessment during this time. Students who have English 10 or Math 10 second Semester will write in June.


