Treasurer:

-Gaming account balance (same numbers we had last time) \$20,161.57

Just received another packet of receipts for \$8300, so will review then write a check.

-Note: we thought we had \$189 that was left over from debate club, but it has been sorted out now (wasn't ours to begin with).

-Checking account, currently at \$3,666.10. That number's about to go down because \$1,500 of that was from the legion for dry grad, so I just wrote a check for that. Also still waiting for \$39 from freezie sales from Zeffy to be posted. So in total we have \$1605, 62 for the bursary, plus the 39 that still has to get posted, and then 560 for our general. So we have made enough to award 3 bursaries.

Secretary:—

SPEAC: biggest thing is that SPEAC is looking for nominations for their executive, like they do every year. Aside from that it was mostly budget talk. Also, they're coming out with a new My ed bc, can be used on mobile phones

Principal / Administration:

-April 2nd, we had a grad assembly. The grads are a great group this year. They are organized, they're keen, they're active. Assembly was good. We told them it's really important to be there for the grad rehearsal at UVic. If you can help emphasize that, that would be helpful. It's on May 26 and they will be bussed over there together, not allowed to drive themselves there.

-The grad blood drive. A group of kids were out at lunch, getting kids to sign up on the app and to sign up for spaces. We have 43 spaces in June. Canadian Blood Services is gonna cab kids back and forth and feed them pizza over there. It's just amazing to see. I think the school group is up to 30 participants and they have 14 people signed up already for the blood drive, so that's really great.

-April 29th, Chelsea Richardson, who's our indigenous ed teacher, has just been doing so much work with one of the role models, Bruce, on Red Dress Day and recognizing recognition for missing and murdered indigenous women and girls, and even around us, we can see the red dresses from Tuesday. And they did this wonderful mural, and classes came down, and Chelsea talked about what the day was about, and what were they recognizing. And it was really great. And it was nice too, to have this during the spring barbeque.

-April 30th was Spring BBQ, we've had really positive feedback. Chef Rowan and the kids did an amazing job of cooking 2,000 burgers. Leadership kids were just working their butts off that day. The freezies PAC sold were really popular- that was a great partnership. PAC made \$198, selling them for \$2 each. Kids were happy playing games, and everybody came in really nicely, too. Music was fantastic, it was a good energy, It was nice like to have the sign and the balloons (this was for PAC handing out Grad Keepsakes).

-Monday it was super hot in the school. Air wasn't working. HVAC staff came out and got it all going again. We will also be putting a special film on the windows to help keep the heat out. It should look like looking through sunglasses, and not affect the view terribly.

-Art show at the Goldfinch Gallery, which is down by the Esquimalt Lagoon, from May 7th to 17.

-May 26th is the commencement rehearsal. We will have extra caps and gowns etc at UVic for the actual grad, just in case someone forgets. SO don't turn around if you forgot something, just get there on time.

-May 27th, we have an ICBC assembly, reminders to grads about safe driving. If there's extra space, they will sometimes invite some gr 11's.

-May 27 to 29, there's the school art show, which is in the 2 conference rooms over in the NLC.

-Caps and gowns will be handed out shortly in the library commons (they have to have handed in all library and text books to get these).

-\*Here there was some discussion regarding lack of parent-teacher interviews this spring. Parents missed them, though a number of parents around the table found a way to do it. Teachers voted to not do them. Message is that parents are allowed to talk to teachers at any time, don't necessarily need a specific day to do this.
